HYMNS FOR HIM — “THIS IS MY FATHER’S WORLD”

This favored hymn was written by Maltbie Babcock, a multi-talented young man from an aristocratic family. A graduate of Syracuse University, he was a brilliant scholar, an outstanding athlete with a winning personality. He directed the university’s orchestra, played several instruments, composed original compositions and was a proficient vocalist, also directing the university glee club.

He would have been successful in any profession, but God called him to the ministry. After seminary at Auburn Theological Seminary in NY state, he became pastor of the First Presbyterian Church in Lockport, NY, a beautiful area, midway between Lake Erie and Lake Ontario, not far from Niagara Falls. Maltbie enjoyed hiking and running in the hills outside town and would tell his secretary, “I’m going out to see my Father’s world.” It was during this pastorate in Lockport that he wrote the sixteen stanza poem with each stanza beginning with the words, “This is My Father’s World.”

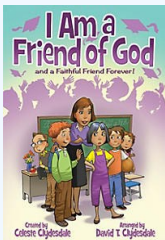
Ultimately in 1899 he moved to the Brick Presbyterian Church in NYC where he found it more difficult to take off on his hikes. When he was 42, his church presented him with a special gift – a pilgrimage to the “Holy Land.” While enroute via ship in Naples, Italy, he was seized with a deadly bacterial fever and died at the International Hospital in May 1901. After his death, his wife compiled his writings into a book entitled *Thoughts for Everyday Living*. It included Maltbie’s “This is My Father’s World.”
