Sermon Series on the Old Testament Story of Job—and his Timeless Questions

"Where were you?"

Our sermon series on Job continues next week with God asking Job a question, "where were you?" . After 37 chapters of Job and his friends struggling for answers, the questions now turn from Job demanding answers of God to God's asking Job a few questions.

From the Whirlwind the Lord shows up and speaks to Job, and it is an amazing conversation! Imagine an almost dream-like experience where God takes Job on a whirlwind tour of the creation of the universe, always asking, "Where were you Job, when I..." Job's hope to see the Lord face to face and get answers is being met. We too see the Lord in the faces of those around us, the very creation in which we live, if we but look.

The Lord's whirlwind tour of the *cosmos* invites Job to take his eyes off himself and look at God's creation, see God's greatness, and understand God as Creator of all and the human's place in that creation. God wants us, to turn to God and confess that we are not God, be reassured that God is in control of the entire created order, even when it seems to be spinning out of control.

Our hope and promise is in Jesus Christ who will yet make all things new; who came to show us God's love, even when the evil of the world overwhelms, even when all seems lost, God's love and goodness triumph. Even as our bodies and lives are so frail, God in Christ Jesus promises to be with us, for us, in us, always, in the deepest love imaginable.
