CONGRATULATIONS TO VICTOR LEESER ON ACHIEVING THE RANK OF EAGLE SCOUT, the highest possible rank in Scouting. This has been achieved following 9 years with the Cub Scout / Boy Scouts where Victor has been actively involved, has held leadership roles and has mastered multiple requirements to earn this prestigious rank. He will be recognized for this achievement during service today. Victor started his Scouting career by joining Pack 119 at South Mecklenburg Presbyterian Church as a Webelo in 2007. He earned his Arrow of Light and joined Troop 119 in 2008. He advanced through the ranks of Tenderfoot, Second Class, First Class, Star, and Life, and earned his Eagle Scout rank in April 2016. Victor is a Brotherhood member of the Order of the Arrow, the National Honor Society of the Boy Scouts. To be considered for selection, a Scout has to meet several requirements involving active participation in the Troop's camping program, in addition to demonstrating mastery of outdoor skills and having a leadership position within the Troop. A Scout has to be voted into OA by his peers. Vic's Eagle project involved planning, funding and leading the assembly and installation of two commercial grade benches on either side of the playground in the back of Hawk Ridge Elementary School. There was no seating for parents or students, so the benches were a wonderful addition to the school. They have been heavily used since the day that they were installed. The Eagle rank is hard to obtain, as it takes several years of dedicated service and active involvement in the Troop. Less than 5% of all Scouts reach the rank of Eagle Scout. As they say in Scouting, "Once an Eagle, always an Eagle." The expectation is that these individuals represent the best of Scouting, and they are charged with demonstrating the highest levels of honesty and integrity throughout their lives.

COUNTDOWN TO SUMMER was a successful festival! We give thanks to God for the weather—no rain Saturday morning, and for all the volunteers who came out and played games, worked the crafts, and served food!
