The InnerNet

May 2018

"Embracing the in-between times," writes blogger, Debie Thomas, "isn't easy; it is a time of wrestling and complaining, of waiting, uncertain how it will all end."

We Christ followers who are one month past the holiest of "In between days," Holy Saturday, can resonate with this idea. The first Holy Saturday was a horrific day of sorrow and grief, for the disciples, women, and followers of Jesus who had experienced his trial, crucifixion, death, and burial. They did not know that Resurrection would happen; it had been promised, but they weren't certain that the tomb would give up the dead, and God would fulfill the promise. They waited until the joy of the empty tomb was revealed and Jesus stood among them breathing out God's peace.

How often do we people of faith find ourselves at moments of "in-between?" Probably more than we can count! Times as simple as a child going to college, to more complex such as waiting between a diagnosis and treatment, to as difficult as the final weeks of a loved one's life, as they move from life here on earth to life everlasting. No matter how simple or complex, each happens, and we aren't always trained by our culture to navigate these times well—we hate to wait, love instant gratification, and delays can feel insurmountable problems. Yet as people of faith, we are given tools, stories, and a church family which can teach us how to wait in Holy Saturday moments.

The story of Joseph from the Old Testament book of Genesis is a great example. Joseph, sold into slavery by his brothers, put in prison by his owner, waited—not hours or months, but years! Yet "...the Lord was with Joseph and showed him steadfast love" in PRISON where he was waiting faithfully on God (Gen. 239.21).

Other stories of our faith ancestors show us the same ability to wait faithfully, knowing God is present. Noah in the Ark waiting for the water to recede, Hannah praying for a child, the Israelites, slaves in Egypt 400 years before freedom! How about Paul, who was struck blind by the Lord for 3 days before a healing and then becoming a powerful missionary, and don't forget all the times Paul was imprisoned, shipwrecked, beaten and run out of town, all in between times of wrestling, complaining, uncertain how it would all end.

In-between waiting is faithful, fruitful, hopeful, even as the outcome is unknown, the time long, the uncertainty hard. How can we use in between times well? As Debie Thomas points out, we can "receive God as God is, wild, uncontrollable, less than predictable." This God will comfort and love us, but may lead us on a journey we're not ready to attempt, but is with us regardless. In between times are also a time to live intentionally—in the now, not the past, not the future, but now. Live and love and accept the reality that is, regardless of how messy it is, receive it "with open hands," Thomas counsels. God uses in between times to transform us, help us recognize the brokenness and beauty of our lives as gifts to God.

Waiting in those Holy Saturday times, are how we grow more resilient, more able to hope, to trust and believe that God is faithful, that God is with us. As we recognize that we are connected to our faith family who support us, that our identity is as Children of God, God's Spirit gives us the ability to hold onto hope, even in uncertainty.

Our congregation has been on this corner of Carmel and Johnston for 40 years. We've had many Holy Saturday in between moments. God has been faithful, is now faithful, and will continue to be faithful to us and for us and with us. What the next 40 years look like is not yet clear, yet as we live and move and have our being in God, we trust God to shine the light in our darkness and lead us into a future bright with promise, full of God's love, and able to continue to proclaim the Gospel of grace and forgiveness to those around us. Thanks be to God.


