Do you feel it? Do you see it? Are you aware of it? It is spilling out and over and around us all the time, yet we are not always tuned in and looking for it. What “it” do I speak of? Why the HOLY SPIR-IT!

The Holy Spirit is alive, active, moving among us, and yet we are sometimes not even aware of it. Yet if you look around at Living Saviour, you catch glimpses, and sometimes even see it fully at work. Like where Pastor?

Like in our Praying for Possibilities teams, their enthusiastic voices echoing through our spaces, lifting our ministry, our campus, our people to God and inviting God to work among us. They pray regularly that God lead people to our worship services that need an experience of God like we offer, and we do receive guests, some who even become members!

Like in our Countdown to Summer 3! What an enthusiastic and amazing free festival we put on for our neighbors. I saw adult children and grandchildren of our church folks attending, community families, and LSLP families come together for a wonderful time! The additional musical groups, the SIGN with the parrot on it, and the Parrots all combined to create an environment for joy and fellowship. I sensed the enthusiasm of the Spirit moving as new folks stepped up to serve and those who served in the past come again. As we opened our doors to share the love of God, the Spirit was present.

Where else do I see Holy Spirit? In the enthusiastic musicians who give selflessly each week of their time and talents to make worship the best it can be. In the hands and faces of those who work behind the scenes to create hospitality for our Sunday coffee, in our fellowship meals and events. I see it at work inviting us as to find ways to serve our world, from folding clothes, or making sandwiches, donating to the food pantry, tutoring at Smithfield, or...so many ways the Spirit shows up, and people full of enthusiasm participate.

An article I read recently, by Bill Wilson, director of Center for Healthy Churches, described the “enthusiasm” of vibrant congregations. The word “enthusiasm” comes from ancient Greek roots, and is a combination of “*en*” and “*theos*,” meaning “having God within us.” Over time, Wilson wrote, “enthusiasm came to mean ‘any rapturous inspiration like that caused by a god’.” Today, we are more likely to use this word to describe our feelings about a favorite athletic team or hobby than to describe what God is doing in and through us.”

We are a community of disciples who serve a Living Savior. Your discipleship shows as you serve, share your enthusiasm for Christ, and together, we keep the words, “boring, stagnant, aimless, tired, tepid” out of the description of our congregation.

We are “*en theos*” and centered in Christ, knit together by the power of the Holy Spirit, and as we come together, whether for worship or learning or outreach or fellowship, our deep and authentic “enthusiasm” comes out and the community can’t help but notice.

As we reflect on 40 years of life together, we know great things are possible. So as you gather at Living Saviour start checking for enthusiasm and the power of the Spirit at work, start dreaming for our future, and how God’s passion, love, purpose, and energy will bless those around us—and those here too!

I rejoice with many prayers of thanksgiving for the ‘enthusiasm’ of this place, because I know it is rooted and grounded in God, through Christ Jesus, by the power of the Holy Spirit.

When Do We Meet: In June - **Monday, June 4 and 18 at 10:00 a.m.** at the church.

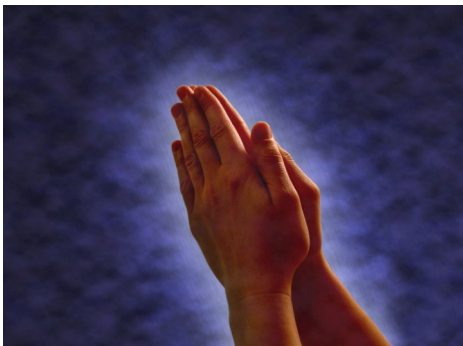

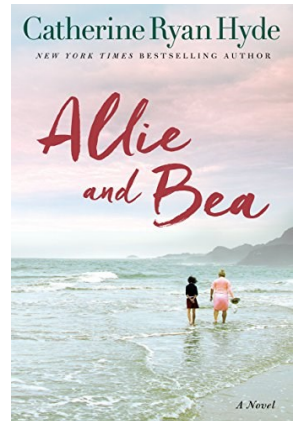
WOMEN OF THE ELCA JUNE ACTIVITIES
