"Forward from Forty: Growing our Future" is the theme of our Fortieth Anniversary and our stewardship campaign. In this 40<sup>th</sup> year of Living Saviour's life we look with respect on our history and look with excitement to our future; honoring where we have been and seeking what God has in store in the future.

We are "making much" if you will of our 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary because the number 40 is a unique one in our scriptures, used some 159 times, and in its original ancient language had the sense of "as long as it takes" which was translated to 40—Noah's 40 days of rain; Moses' 40 years of wilderness wanderings; Jesus' 40 days of wilderness temptations; Jonah's proclamation to Nineveh in which God gave them 40 days to repent; Goliath taunted the Israelite army 40 days; the season of Lent is 40 days (not counting Sundays). Forty is a number of judgement, of waiting, of significance. So in this 40<sup>th</sup> year as a faith community, we want to honor our past, and seek God's future as Living Saviour Lutheran Church, a uniquely planted community of faith, on this piece of ground in the city of Charlotte, retaining the best of our faith tradition while seeking new pathways to share the faith and gospel with the generations to come.

We are having a single <u>Unity worship service on Sunday October 7, 2018, at 10:00 a.m.</u> a full traditional celebration of our Lutheran heritage, with Bishop Tim Smith preaching, and our former pastors in attendance. A catered lunch (<u>reservations only</u>, see the website/newsletter/mailed invitation) follows. It is promising to be an exciting day, and we hope you will join us.

As we move "Forward from Forty" and continue to look at what it means to "Grow our Future" we are planning another exciting event, a first for Living Saviour's recent memory, a faith-filled, fellowship, learning retreat. This October 19-23 SHIFT weekend, will help us honor our past, look at who we are now, and how the culture is shifting from Christ-centered, to less Christian, "spiritual but not religious" and less trusting of institutions such as Church. What is God calling us to be and to do in the midst of such huge cultural shifts? Come and find out, see what part of God's dream you can do, learn how we are able to tap into the great need the community around us has for Christ and grow God's kingdom.

We will follow up the SHIFT weekend with a team who will work to discern God's dream and distill it into a strategic plan, crafting mission and vision statements, and sharing this with the congregation. You will then be part of the vibrant community of faith that implements these ideas and goals for our future growth.

It took vision and a sense of mission to plant Living Saviour Lutheran Church forty years ago. It continues to take a vision and sense of mission to continue on, seeking out those who do not know, searching for those who need what God offers through this congregation, working to be people deployed to be Church in the world.

I hope you will join in and participate, no matter how long or how short you have been connected to Living Saviour, you are this Church, you are important to God, to me, to the community of faith.

Don Huff, our wonderful Director of Worship and Music, has been on staff at LSLC since 1989!


Camp Vivace, our exciting summer music/theater camp for children, had its start in 1998.


#### PASSION PLAY, OBERAMMERGAU, GERMANY 2020

#### **CONTRIBUTIONS FOR THOSE OVER 70 YEARS OF AGE**




Have you or your loved ones aged 70 1/2 contributed to IRAs and 401Ks? Money withdrawn is subject to income tax when you take withdrawals in retirement. Annual withdrawals from traditional retirement accounts are required after age 70 1/2, and the penalty for skipping a required minimum distribution is 50 percent of the amount that should have been withdrawn. However, if you don't need all the money for living expenses and wish to, you can avoid income tax on your required withdrawal by donating your money directly to a qualifying charity. You can donate part of your required distribution to charity and withdraw the rest of it as retirement income as

long as you meet the minimum distribution requirement by the end of the calendar year. You don't have to donate the full distribution, but can directly distribute to multiple charities. Check with your financial advisor for the full details.

"A way to reach out in Christian love to those who need special blessings"




**Who We Are:** A group of 8 to 10 ladies who knit/crochet prayer shawls at our meetings and at home. Each prayer shawl receives a special blessing.

#### STEWARDSHIP OF OUR CHURCH

At all times there must be and remain one holy, Christian church. It is the assembly of all believers among whom the gospel is purely preached and the holy sacraments are administered according to the gospel.

#### **Augsburg Confession, Article VII**

Steward-discipleship means taking care of all that God has blessed us with. We think of our health, our relationships and our money, but our church? You bet!

The church the only organization whose *primary purpose* is to bring people into intimate relationship with God and also gather them as sacred community. Without church, how would people grow in faith? How would the Gospel be spread to all nations, as Jesus commands in Matthew 28:19, 20?

So what does it mean to be a good steward of our church? Here are some ideas:

**Focus:** We are dedicated to God's Word and Sacrament as the means by which God's grace is poured into us and out to the world. Our service projects and social events may flow from this, but they are secondary.

**Community:** As the Augsburg Confession (above) declares, the church is the community of God's people dedicated to Word and Sacrament. We build strong community through healthy relationships guided by principles of Christian love, trust, honesty, truth, forbearance, forgiveness.

**Building:** Our building is NOT <u>the</u> church, but a tool of the church for ministry. We provide the resources to maintain our building as useful for the Gospel, but feel free to move on if it no longer serves.

**Resources:** Understanding that ministry to God's people takes resources, we give generously of our time and talents. We strive to give a tithe – 10 percent of our financial blessings.

**Faith formation:** It takes learning and practice to grow closer to God, both as individuals and community. We support and participate in studying the Bible and theology. We promote and engage in spiritual practices that feed our souls.

Although we tend to think that our church has a mission, it's more accurate to say that God has a mission, and that mission has a church. We grow in faith as people and community when we dedicate ourselves to good stewardship of our church.
