Forty years ago, in 1978, President Jimmy Carter was in the White House, and had a Xerox Alto computer installed in the Oval Office. There was no printer at that time; the poor staffers had to share a Hewlett-Packard HP3000. My how times change! What many of us hold in our hands, our cell phone, is more powerful than these first computers, and give us access to the WORLD! We can find out the price of gold in the UK, explore Cleveland Ohio without leaving home, or look up what the word, *obsequious* means. In a mere 40 years, life is totally different through the development of technology.

That is not the only thing changed in 40 years. The way we get food—some of you may have food delivered to your door by Amazon, or use a meal service which delivers prepared ingredients ready to freshly cook for a hot family meal. Think about how you travel—from making reservations to using a voice guided mapping system like Google Maps, things continue to change and evolve. Then there is the way you pay for things—anyone simply pass your phone over a terminal and voila! Apple-pay takes care of the rest?

Then again, if you have no idea about how to use these things or no idea they even exist, some might suggest the world is passing you by, because I guarantee you, those under 40 have many such experiences, and may have no idea what to do with a Thesaurus or a Rand-McNally Road Atlas, and have only vaguely heard of a World Book Encyclopedia, nor can they remember when ATM's didn't exist.

Our world, the world your children, grandchildren, great-grands is growing up in looks in some ways the same as it did 40 years ago, and in some ways, vastly different. Families still want to pass on values, morals, traditions, but the way they do so is changing. Families who may have grown up in the church do not always attend now, or even value the religious tradition. Increasingly, grandparents are taking responsibility for faith forming activities for grandchildren as parents give the church a "pass."

What does this mean for disciples in 2018? What can we do when the culture around us has shifted and is not the same? First we can learn about these trends, what and why and how they are; then, we can prayerfully respond, asking God to show us how we can strategically plan to live into God's dream of a kingdom of disciples who respond to God's grace. We have God's love in our hearts, and an ability to learn and adapt. We want to continue to be a traditional Lutheran worshipping community, while exploring what else we might consider, what else God is calling us to do to respond to those who have not heard the word of God's grace.

"No longer am I content to engage in hand-wringing, complaining, or even grieving over the demise of the culture which supported the age of Christendom in this country. Now, I'm eager to engage the world as we find it with the very good news of the gospel, as expressed in fresh ways. SHIFT provides a realistic description of our current context, followed by three very hopeful currents now flowing through the Church. I am so eager to engage in sacred partnering with those ready to move ahead with bold and courageous faith in this Christian Movement."—Rev. Mark Tidsworth

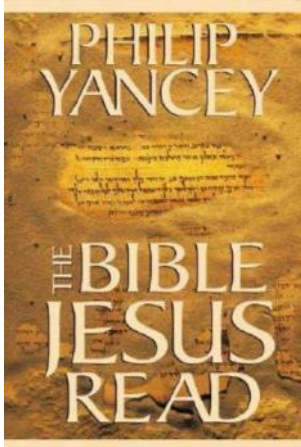

CONTRIBUTIONS FOR THOSE OVER 70 YEARS OF AGE



Have you or your loved ones aged 70 1/2 contributed to IRAs and 401Ks? Money withdrawn is subject to income tax when you take withdrawals in retirement. Annual withdrawals from traditional retirement accounts are required after age 70 1/2, and the penalty for skipping a required minimum distribution is 50 percent of the amount that should have been withdrawn. However, if you don't need all the money for living expenses and wish to, you can avoid income tax on your required withdrawal by donating your money directly to a qualifying charity. You can donate part of your required distribution to charity and withdraw the rest of it as retirement income as long as you meet the minimum distribution requirement by the end of the calendar year. You don't have to donate the full distribution, but can directly distribute to multiple charities. Check with your financial advisor for the full details.

WELL DONE GOOD AND FAITHFUL SERVANT!

This year's **God's Work Our Hands** was a blessing to so many- to all of you that served and to all those that will benefit from your efforts- and that is hundreds of people- young, old and in between. We had over 100 church members participate in at least one of the 15 projects offered. All these projects required a leader and we give thanks to those that served in this capacity- we could not do this without many leaders and their helpful teams!

Following is a summary of what was accomplished through the various projects:

- The church kitchen was scrubbed and organized
- 65 teachers from Smithfield Elementary enjoyed a lunch, free gifts and door prizes
- The sacristy and altar area was organized and lovingly cleaned and polished
- Two senior residential communities enjoyed a sing along by church members
- 192 pencil pouches filled with small school supplies were assembled and donated to Classroom Central
- Firefighters and police officers and their families were treated to a picnic at Jack Hughes Park in Pineville
- 20 fleece blankets were prepared, hand tied and then donated to Crisis Assistance Ministry to be distributed to children in need
- 28 totes were assembled- filled with kitchen tools, paper goods, dish towels, pot holders and cleaning supplies to be distributed to families moving into more sustainable housing through Lutheran Services Carolinas. Extra items were donated for future distribution
- Over 100 pairs of shoes were donated to Soles4Souls and shipped by Zappos at no cost to LSLC
- 100 gift totes were assembled and notes written to families with a child facing serious health issues at Levine Children's Hospital NICU
- 70 paper grocery bags were filled to the brim with school supplies and delivered to be distributed to students in need at Smithfield Elementary School
- 12 homeless women were comfortable for 7 nights here at LSLC and enjoyed breakfast, lunch and dinner provided by our church family
- The church yard- including plaza area and outside worship space- was trimmed, painted and preserved
- All the pew kneelers in the sanctuary were checked for proper working order and "silencers"
- A beautiful art installation was created by participants of Sunday's projects
- A delicious lunch was prepared for the over 100 project volunteers
- 200 lunches were prepared and delivered to Crisis Assistance Ministry
