Congregations which learn to make the SHIFT from modern to post-modern ways have a higher rate, not of survival, but of growing God's kingdom, creating disciples who live and love as Jesus did, and who are willing to live out of this love for the sake of the world. Congregations willing to explore the future discover God's dreams, and hopes for the world and how they can participate.

Five hundred-one years ago Martin Luther began working to reform the church, not create a new one. These 501 years have seen many changes in the structures of church, but not in the good news of God's love made real in Jesus Christ. We continue in this tradition of reform, seeking to use new ways to grow God's kingdom of love, create disciples who love God and one another, and who gather to worship God, so that they are renewed to go and serve God's world.

Our vision statement, "A community of disciples in service to the Living Savior" sets a course for Living Saviour. How can you be part of this community? Where do you learn what being a disciple of Jesus means? Where do you serve our Living Savior? Come and be part of growing the future as we move forward from forty, in Christ, with Christ, forever.

FOCUS ON STEWARDSHIP: DECIDING TO BECOME DISCIPLES AND GIVING SACRIFICIALLY



Little was ever accomplished without sacrifice. This is true in our homes, our work, our church, our country. Jesus says in Matthew 6.21 that "where your treasure is, there will be your heart also. As we approach our stewardship drive this year, perhaps we can focus a bit more on where we want our heart. If it is here in this congregation, then we need to look at how we can become disciples. We can give a bit more sacrificially....and joyfully.

And so it is with the Christian life and faith. Our salvation cost God the cross. Dietrich Bonhoeffer, a Lutheran Minister and Theologian was imprisoned by the Nazis in 1943 for his resistance work and later was hung by them during the last days of World War II, wrote in "The Cost of Discipleship" there is no cheap grace.

Studies have shown that often, church giving is only token giving, averaging about two percent of income. We have given only what we could easily afford, what we would not really miss. Experience has shown that giving, to be meaningful and joyful, has to be sacrificial! Each will have to determine what amount or percentage is sacrificial for his or her circumstances. But experience again suggests that for most people sacrificial giving begins at five percent of income with proportions under five percent falling into the token giving category.


