Generous. Gracious. Giving. Would you use these words to describe God? Why? Why not? When you look at the whole of God's word, the Bible, you get to see where and how God is generous. From creating the world and all that is in it, to calling out the people of Israel, leading them from bondage in Egypt, creating a covenant, loving and forgiving them time and again, to sending a savior for all the world's redemption, to creating a church and empowering it to love and live as the Body of Christ for the sake of the world, we experience a Generous, Giving, Gracious God.

As we read the stories Jesus told we hear and see more fully God's generosity. Imagine the 5000 people with no food, and the generous act of a child who shared a basket of bread and fish. See the Prodigal Father watching and waiting for a wayward son to return, who greets him with open arms and heart, full of forgiveness. See the act of our Lord opening his arms on the cross so that all the world might be reconciled to God once again. These stories and more show us God's generosity, God's ever expanding love and grace; God's "antidote to the greed and hoarding that lead to scarcity, the means by which God brings forth the abundant life that Jesus promises. Generosity is no less than the means by which God ushers in the Kingdom," according to Ann A. Michel in her recent article on stewardship.

Have you ever met a tiny child who was so willing to share with you, whether a soggy cheerio, or their favorite toy, or a hug; it seems that very young children are born with an innate sense of sharing, and that sharing is a reflection of our Creator. We believe we are created in the image of God, we live as Christ-followers who desire to model a godly life as we are empowered by the Holy Spirit; so how do we reflect and participate in God's generous, giving, graciousness in and to the world?

At the end of our Church year, as we end November, we may spend some time in gratitude reflection--in fact, I encourage it! Many social media posts during the month of November ask us to name things for which we are grateful, and I strongly encourage you, as an act of discipleship, to spend 15 minutes sometime post-Thanksgiving to reflect on all for which you are thankful. Give thanks to God for the wonders of creation, the beauty of earth, sky, and nature's vast variety. Give thanks to God for the many ways you are able to live, love, work, play, enjoy life. Give thanks to God for God's gracious gift of GRACE shown to us in the empty cross and tomb, celebrated in the Resurrection every week as we gather at the table.

As you reflect on the things for which you are grateful, consider how God invites you to collaborate in ushering in God's kingdom here where our church is located, and in your own home and neighborhood. Consider how God invites you to partner in being generous with your time and money.

Being God's partner in the mission of loving and redeeming the world is to be a steward; a disciple of Christ "who acknowledges God's sovereignty in all that we do and to understand that God wants us to use what has been entrusted to us to serve God's purposes," says Ann A. Michel. As we use the resources we are entrusted, to care for our church, our faith community and the wider community, we are partnering with God in acts of generosity, grace, and giving. As we partner with Living Saviour by returning our stewardship statement of intent cards, and making our offerings, we are doing more than fundraising. We are being disciples and God's partners in loving the world God graciously made, generously gave us to inhabit, and graciously invites us to model for others God's acts of generosity, grace and giving.

ROOM IN THE INN

December is the start of another season of Room In The Inn – our eleventh year of participating in Shelter Ministries. Each Sunday night from December 2 until March 31, our volunteers pick up 12 homeless neighbors – men, women and frequently, children – at the Urban Ministry Center and bring them to our church. They are greeted here by other volunteers who are able to offer them a bed, clean showers and a hearty meal. Two volunteers stay through the night and wake everybody at 5 a.m. for breakfast, a bagged lunch and the shuttle bus ride back down to the Charlotte Transit Center. Some must get there early to catch a bus to get to their job.

Later on Monday, still more volunteers will launder the towels and sheets and clean the showers and bathrooms.

FOCUS ON STEWARDSHIP: CELEBRATING YOUR GENEROSITY

Your generosity this year has allowed Living Saviour as a vital, caring community to grow in its mission to build bridges to the greater community and our ministry of Worship and Caring. As we approach the end of the year, we want to keep the growing ministry we have done together in front of you. A recent study shows that 35% of giving happens in America in December and we believe some of your additional generosity and giving can happen to this congregation as you consider making a special extra end of year gift.

This year we have been able to accomplish our goals and more:

- *We responded to the Women and Children's shelter ministry request to provide housing during the extremely high temperatures experienced in Charlotte this summer, helping relieve overcrowded conditions and provide care for homeless women with children for 1 week
- *We made much needed repairs and improvements to our building and property, including skylight and roof repairs to stop water leaks, and enhancing the grounds.
- *Committed to a week of Christian summer camp called Lutheroad, led by counselors from Lutheridge; and with your continued generosity, we plan to off-set some of the cost for our children, and supplement the cost of before and after camp care for those with working parents.

There is more to do and we need to pay for what we have already done. We are projecting that we will be close to balancing our budget. With extreme generosity, we will have more revenue than expenses. In that case, we will:


- *Replace ahead of schedule the phone system and fire alarm systems that are aging and becoming increasing obsolete and difficult to repair
- *Continue to build our ministry partnership with the staff at Smithfield Elementary
- *Repair the potholes in the parking lot; purchase new signs for our visitor and handicap spots
- *Provide the books for our "Making the Shift" small groups, which will begin forming in January
- *schedule a week of summer shelter 2019, with a safe and cool space for women and children
