# **MARCH 2019**



The North Carolina synod of the ELCA is composed of 199 congregations across this great state, from Murphy to Manteo we like to say. Of those 199 congregations, 50 have less than 50 persons on average in Sunday worship, 50 have between 50 and 100 on Sunday, and the remainder more than 100. Living Saviour in the year 2018 averaged 139 in worship each Sunday. That gives you a snapshot of where we are numerically.

Your dollars support the North Carolina synod; a portion of all our offerings makes the mission and ministry of our synod happen. That includes caring for the staff, the synod building, with dollars filtering down to the camps, colleges, and agencies, such as Lutheran Disaster Relief and Lutheran Services Carolinas. The Synod is us! We are the synod!

You may not know, but every 3 years, each rostered person is required to go through a "Boundary Training" refresher course. Pastoral ethics, protecting congregations and leaders from any impropriety, taking care of the financial aspects of the congregation as well as being aware of youth, social media, and other issues that can entangle a congregation are topics covered. New this year is a session on racism, designed to help us be aware of the ways our cultural norms hinder us from acting with equity and justice.

Your synod produced the entire series of "Seriously" podcasts, addressing women in ministry, with a study guide available to use for discussion in the congregation or small groups. Our synod also offers training courses on financial matters, preaching studies, the latest in Christian education reforms, as well as how to relate to youth and the aging. The synod works hard to provide new ways of helping individual congregations with resources for media, learning, and difficult topics. The staff is a fantastic resource in many matters and helps with everything from answering simple or complex questions to actually visiting on-site for very complex matters. At the end of this month, a group of selected leaders who are trying holy innovations are convening for a time of study, learning, and cross-pollination of ideas, and I am invited to participate!

We have been the recipient of two grants distributed through the NC Synod who oversee the Casey-Peeler funds. The first was for \$5000 to be used for Smithfield Elementary school to benefit the students of greatest need, such as coats, food for the weekend backpacks, as well as school needed items such as for the health room. We also received a \$5000 grant which funded our Shift weekend and provided books for our Making the Shift small groups. We give thanks for this partnership, and for the funds provided.

We are synod together. I rejoice in how our NC Synod is governed by a Synod Council, elected by you who attend synod assembly each year, composed of lay and rostered leaders; is cared for by a competent staff, and a bishop who is passionate, loving, and cares for each congregation, leader, and the traditions of the ELCA. I give thanks for our Synod, because together we make a difference in the world.

Our Sunday worship will use the theme, Cultivating and Letting God, which will incorporate the scriptures with the ideas that we cultivate some faith practices and let go of those things which bind us. We will have some art projects, some art reflections, some poems, and worship which will help us cultivate God's good and let go of that which is necessary.

- -Wednesday mid-week services will focus on the theme of Open My Life Lord, and will last about 30 minutes. Wednesday March 13-April 10. A refreshing break to spend some time with God and your faith community.
- -Video weekly devotionals, using a piece of art work, and a "Visio Divina" style of bible study.
- -A Healing Service Sunday March 24 at 3 p.m. We will use the story of the Good Samaritan and the theme of cultivate confidence in God, hope, calm and let go of doubt, anxiety, fear, busyness.
- -Weekly devotional booklets will be available. These booklets are prepared by the younger generation of up and coming artists and theologians, and offer a view of "cultivating and letting go" which may challenge, confront, and comfort you. Each week will provide a weekly reflection, a space to meditatively color in, and journal prompts. It begins with Ash Wednesday and concludes with Good Friday, offering a connection to the weekly video devotions, Sunday worship, and the season of Lent.

#### **PET MINISTRY**



What is a pet ministry? We are an animal loving group that support the well-being of animals. We have a memorial garden in the lower parking lot. We meet approximately every four to six weeks. The meetings are about an hour, held after the 10:30 service. We respond to the passing of a pet (when we are notified) by sending cards. The best way to notify the ministry of your loss is to send an email to the church office. They will relay the information to our group and a card will be sent. We adopted the Humane

Society of Charlotte for the year. We will try to hold a donation drive quarterly for their cause. The first one kicked off in January, due to their urgent need. I don't know that all realize the food collected supports the pet food bank. They feed dogs and cats in homes that have a need. They also support dogs and cats through the Mecklenburg County Senior Citizen Nutrition Program (formerly Meals on Wheels) as well as for homebound clients with other programs such as Friendship Trays. I think it is a wonderful idea. I know if someone brought me food and I couldn't afford pet food, the furry kids would get at least half if not more of my meal. #### SHARING THE ABUNDANCE GOD HAS PROVIDED FOR MEMBERS AFTER REACHING 70 YEARS OF AGE



Many of us have been blessed with an abundance of treasures we have been able to accumulate through IRAs and 401Ks and find that tax regulations mandate we withdraw amounts prescribed by those regulations after reaching 70 1/2 years on contributions to IRAs and 401Ks. Money withdrawn is subject to income tax when you take withdrawals in retirement and may actually raise you into higher tax rates. Annual withdrawals from traditional retirement accounts are required after age 70 1/2, and the penalty for skipping a required minimum distribution is 50 percent of the amount that should have

been withdrawn. Some of us are fortunate and don't need all the money for living expenses and may wish to avoid income tax on your required withdrawal by donating your money directly to a qualifying charity. You can donate part of your required distribution to charity and withdraw the rest of it as retirement income as long as you meet the minimum distribution requirement by the end of the calendar year. You don't have to donate the full distribution, but can directly distribute to multiple charities. Check with your financial advisor for the full details.



#### SUMMARY OF FINANCIAL FINAL RESULTS FOR FISCAL YEAR ENDING JANUARY 31, 2019

Below is a brief report of the results for the Fiscal Year ending January 31, 2019. We had a net income of \$5,426, which is the result of being under on expenses more than we were under on contributions. Our budget was prepared assuming we would almost exactly break even.



#### WEDNESDAY MORNING BIBLE STUDY




We are continuing our study of "The Bible Jesus Read."

February 10<sup>th</sup> Valentine's Party – We enjoyed great food and fellowship as our kids made decorations for their shelter buddies.


