I will be heading off on a pilgrimage in Turkey and Greece, in search of the origins, the culture, the place that gave rise to Christianity and to the Apostle Paul. I will be leaving the Tuesday after Easter (April 23) and returning to the office after May 12. Emergency coverage if the need arises, as well as supply pastors are lined up. Turkish lira and EU euros are in hand, passport, entry visas, and all documents are ready. I've read several books, articles, and had on-line discussions with travel companions. Brian is staying home to keep the dogs in line, and I am excited to be heading off on an adventure.

What makes this a pilgrimage and not a tourist trip? The reason for going is one difference. I seek to expand my knowledge of the culture into which God called Saul/Paul to stop persecuting the Jesus followers and to start proclaiming God's Messiah has come. The trip will look at the cult of the Emperor, the religious culture of the Greco-Roman Empire, and the way Christianity spread. From humble beginnings in Jerusalem to the point where Emperor Constantine proclaimed Christianity the religion of the land in 313. What happened between those points in time that created a belief that the God of Christ was the only true God to follow? That is what we are seeking to discover. Also, did Paul write all the letters in the New Testament attributed to him? Did he change his tone or mind because there are some definite difficulties with what he wrote in one verses another (and not he did not write all the letters, probably not even all that is in some of the letters, but that is for another time).

A pilgrimage is a seeking of new knowledge, new insights into God and self. I hope I can draw all that together to make me a better teacher, preacher and student of theology. There will be no fancy dinners; just good food and good company, lots of walking, exploring ancient ruins, bus rides, ferries across the Mediterranean Sea. We will travel off the beaten path and to the big cities of Istanbul and Athens. I am traveling with a variety of people from across this USA, all Lutherans. Some pastors and others regular church folk, all who wish to explore our faith and these ancient letters written by Paul, who proclaims himself least of the apostles, yet one called by the Lord himself to go on mission to the non-Jews, the gentiles.

Thank you for your on-going financial support of Living Saviour as the trip cost are partially covered by your giving to my continuing education fund. I also received a scholarship from the trip organizers awarded to those in ministry 10 years or less (this is my 10th year), and a scholarship from our NC Synod, Leaders Learn fund. I look forward to harvesting what I have learned and experienced, and sharing that with you in the summer with a sermon series on Paul and early Christianity. Pray for me, for Brian, and for our group as we head off in "Search of Paul" in Turkey and Greece April 23-May 10.

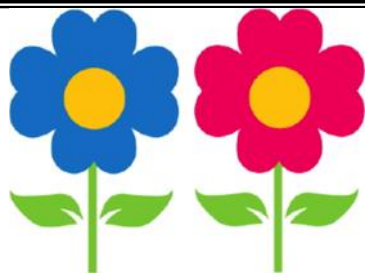

PROPERTY MINISTRY

The Property Ministry is focused on making sure that safe and comfortable facilities are available for our community of disciples as we gather to worship and engage in education and outreach activities at LSLC. I want to take a moment to thank all who supported and continue to donate to the successful Forward from Forty Campaign. You have helped establish a financial foundation to complete current and future maintenance in our beautiful facilities!

This month, I would like to highlight the lighting project that was just completed. If you visited our facilities recently, you may have noticed that the Sanctuary is better lit than previously. This is not just the brighter spring sunshine! A group of stubborn volunteers refused to believe that our lights could not be traded out for new LED fixtures without costing thousands of dollars. Ron Gordon took it upon himself to research what our fixtures were and what light kits and bulbs could be used to convert them. He ordered and gathered help from a small but interested team to try a couple products before choosing the final solutions. He even held a session after Services one Sunday to discuss what he'd learned and what he proposed to move ahead. Then he prepared a careful budget, estimated the time, the specific skills needed, equipment, and labor to make it all happen so it could be approved. From there many others pitched in to get it done! Larry Wagstaff provided his electrical expertise and scaffolding which he and Janet put together. Shallen Gordon made multiple runs to Home Depot and Lowes for bulbs. Eric Forster helped with additional electrical expertise and labor. Others helped move chairs, scaffolding and hand up supplies to Ron over several weeks to complete the work including Brandon Ward, Frank DeLoache, Marty Jenkins and Steve Axtman. My biggest thanks goes out to everyone who had a hand in making the project successful and I sincerely apologize if I've missed anyone.

Other recent improvements made include the following:

- Lighting replacements in the Fellowship Hall, kitchen and other areas (Larry Wagstaff)
- Stairwell closest to the Sanctuary painted, steps scrubbed (Janet Wagstaff & helpers)
- Fire panel was replaced (aged into obsolescence)
- New phone system identified and ordered (Shallen Gordon and phone committee)
- Kitchen disposal was replaced, clean ceiling tiles installed and many other maintenance activities were completed (Larry Wagstaff, Steve Axtman and others)

Many additional projects are being planned this spring and summer. I will be asking for help and know that we can trust in God and each other to get it done.

PALM SUNDAY



The Altar Guild Team would like to make you aware of a change we are making for Palm Sunday. This year we will be partnering with the ELCA, Lutheran World Relief, and several other organizations in supporting **Eco-Palms**. Eco-Palms is a Fair Trade Organization protecting the environment and promoting social justice by supporting gatherers in Guatemala who are paid a fair wage for their harvesting efforts. Eco-Palms are gathered in a way that the natural forest conditions are respected and sustained.

So what does this change mean for us? The biggest change you will see is that your palm will no longer be a single stem. It will be a green multi leaf palm. There will still be enough palms for each church member to wave. However, the palms we wave are actually going to a great cause! We are collecting food items through April 7. Food will be delivered on April 11-12. Following is a list of items needed:

RESULTS FOR FISCAL YEAR ENDING JANUARY, 2020

Below is a brief report for the Fiscal Year ending January 31, 2020; as of the end of February (which is our first month of the fiscal year). We had a net income of \$5,835, which is primarily the result of being under on expenses. In addition, we were over on contributions, due to a transfer from the Designated and Memorial Fund. Our annual budget was prepared assuming we would have a (loss) of \$(9,692).

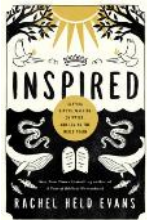
