2 Corinthians 8:1-7 New Revised Standard Version (NRSV)

8 *We want you to know, brothers and sisters, about the grace of God that has been granted to the churches of Macedonia; ²for during a severe ordeal of affliction, their abundant joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity on their part. ³For, as I can testify, they voluntarily gave according to their means, and even beyond their means, ⁴begging us earnestly for the privilege of sharing in this ministry to the saints...*

In the time this second letter to the Corinthians was written, there was an appalling food shortage in Jerusalem; the churches Paul started in Greece were collecting funds to help the people of Jerusalem survive. Even as they themselves lived in poverty, they gave freely, with overflowing generosity, and abundant joy, knowing they were helping the family of faith. These early disciples understood that all they received was a gift from God, and as disciples they returned a tithe, or a portion, back to those who needed it—the gathered body of Christ, who distributed the goods and money to the widows, orphans, hungry, destitute.

How is your giving to God? Does it come with an abundance of joy that you are able to share generously back to God and the church a portion of what you have received? Abundant joy and overflowing generosity are the characteristics of disciples of Jesus, who are living the way of Jesus, seeking to more fully follow him. The leaders of Living Saviour are deeply encouraged by the attitude of giving here, not only financially, but also a sharing of time and talent. We see abundant joy, overflowing generosity, and want to share what we see.

Overflowing generosity is evident in the Diana Slusser memorial garden beautifying the lower entrance of our building. Using funds from Diana's memorial, and the labor of Dan Slusser, Linda Honeycutt, the Axtman's and the Wagstaff's, we have a lovely entrance which enhances our joy and shows an overflowing generosity.

We celebrate the abundance and joyful attitudes of giving of time and resources which support so many. Those who teach, work, prepare, clean up, set up, take down, do so many things to keep this congregational facility looking excellent. You are generous to the food pantry, Smithfield, and Crisis Assistance. You pray for each other, bring communion to the homebound, prepare meals for the sick, and comfort the grieving. Celebrate your participation in these opportunities to give generously from your hearts.

When a need for funding to expand our ministry to Smithfield Elementary and the Summer Shelter existed, you stepped up with joy and generosity! Breakfast in July with matching funds, meant we were able to raise money to help feed the hungry students at Smithfield this school year. The "Jazz for a Cautz" Valentine's Day event supported by those who worked to make it a reality and those who bought tickets, meant we were able to host 12 women for a week this summer. I wonder if we could do an additional week with a boost in giving? What dreams for outreach have we deferred due to budget constraints? Generosity and joy can make dreams reality. Celebrate what we already do, dream of what God may be calling us toward.

The leaders of your congregation are asking for an increase in funds for 2020. We desire an abundance of resources for our worship team, with additional musicians, new music, and continued maintenance for our organ, piano, and hand bells. Our goal is to send our pastor and music director to conferences for learning, and to provide a living wage commiserate with their knowledge, experience, and value. Worship is the core of what we do as a congregation and giving this area expanded resources is an abundant joy and takes generous hearts.

ROOM IN THE INN 2019-2020



December, which is only weeks away, is the start of Living Saviour's 12th year of Shelter Ministry. Every Sunday night from **December 1 until March 29** our church welcomes 12 homeless neighbors – men, women and frequently children – to our campus. These neighbors are sent to us through Urban Ministry of Charlotte for Room In The Inn.

We offer our neighbors a warm and comfortable respite with a hearty meal, clean showers, comfortable beds for a good night's sleep followed by an early breakfast, a bag lunch to go and a drop off at the downtown Transit Center.

We have a really great set up here at Living Saviour for our guests including 12 hotel style rollaway beds with nice sheets and blankets. (Our overnight hosts sleep in the same rollaway beds in rooms separate from our neighbors.) We have two beautifully tiled showers for the neighbors and two rooms with upholstered furniture – not folding chairs – for television or movie viewing. And we offer not just good food, but the opportunity to SHARE meals and conversation with our people of faith.

Every Sunday night from December 1 to March 29 – that's 18 Sundays. For each Sunday's guests this ministry requires a shuttle bus driver, 2 overnight hosts, an evening meal prep team, bag lunch preparers, a laundry team and a Monday morning quick clean up person. We are blessed to have returning volunteers in each area, but we are in great need of additional volunteers.

If you are looking for a way to participate in a meaningful ministry...this is it! Where else can such simple tasks as doing laundry, or serving a meal, taking out trash, or sleeping on a rollaway bed be truly God's work!

Please look for information/sign-up sheets on the portable wall system in the weeks to come and look for your opportunity to add your name as a volunteer to this amazing ministry. Our homeless neighbors are waiting for you!

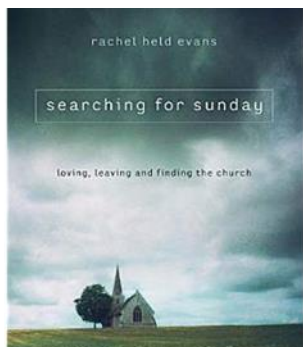

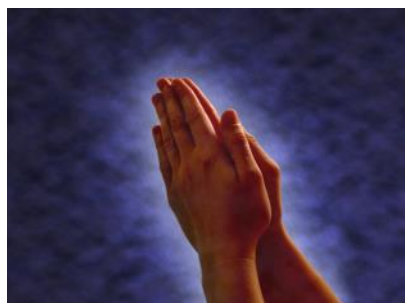
