A familiar bible passage to those of us who live in the rhythms of the church and Christian life, and a passage that takes on new meaning as Living Saviour continues our "Forward from Forty" movement of planning for the next forty years. Winter and spring of 2019, the council extended invitations to all to participate in the SHIFT weekend retreat and small group sessions learning about the great cultural and religious shifts going on in the world. In the past month, all again were encouraged to take part in the Core Values workshop, seeking our defining Core Values, the foundational words that help us understand what is important to us; about 50 persons took part in these gatherings. Now it is the task of the Strategic Planning Team to "put flesh on the word"

so that the Word which is God, can work on us, transform us, lead us to the next steps in life together. The results were surprisingly consistent, with all groups using words such as music, liturgy, sacramental, caring and sharing. Others included words such as hospitality, community, prayerful.

The strategic planning team, a group of folks who were invited to prayerfully reflect on who we are and what our purpose is, as God's Church here in South Charlotte, will work to "flesh out" the meanings of the value words for Living Saviour. Their tasks are to examine the current mission and vision statements, adjust them if necessary, look at the newly identified core values, and set some future forward goals, which will lead us toward God's dream for our congregation with the people, gifts, skills, financial resources, facility, and location God has gifted to us.

We have done good work for the kingdom of God in the past 40+ years. Our desire is to continue to grow God's kingdom in the future. Yet we know that the world has changed dramatically, that people are "Done" with church (that is they have been there, done that), there are more "Nones" (those who have no experience or concept of God or church), and a group of those who are searching for meaning and yet are not sure where to find it. All challenges to us, who love God, love this congregation, find meaning and value in being part of the things of the church. The Strategic Planning Team will explore our challenges, resources, strengths, and opportunities to share God's love, as we seek to put flesh on the word—both the word of the core values, and the word of our next steps (strategy).

On December 1, we enter Advent, the first season of the church year, a sort of "New Year" season. Advent means, "Coming or revealing," and we prepare for the future coming of Christ, as well as look back to the past coming of the Christ child. It is fitting that the Strategic Planning Team continue the work of fleshing out the Core Values, the mission and the vision God has in mind for the people of God at Living Saviour Lutheran Church in the year 2020 and beyond. Please pray for us as we work on your behalf. Stay tuned as we continue to share with you our findings, prayerful discernment, and best understanding of what God is about in 2020 here in South Charlotte.

December 1st begins the season of Advent, a 4-week long season, providing a time to stop amid the crazy, frenzied, hurry of the days leading up to December 25. In the world of the Christian church, Advent means "Coming or Revealing" and refers to Christ's second coming as well as his first appearing as an infant in the manger. During the season of Advent, our worship theme is "What Can't Wait" and each week we will take time to stop and see what God is revealing. Join us in worship on Sundays at 8:30 or 10:30. Sunday, December 15, at 10:30 we will experience again the familiar Christmas story with an inter-generational presentation; while our 8:30 service will be the "usual."

As our congregation has continued to age, and traffic continues to be the worst during the evening rush hour, we will once again do a You-Tube presentation of our Advent mid-week worship. Join **Pastor Angela** as she prepares a simple worship, giving you time to stop, reflect, listen, and experience God at your own pace and time. CARING AND SHARING SCHEDULE CHANGE


