20/20 VISION

Clear vision is important to all of us, which is why we wear corrective lenses, have Lasik surgery, and receive a thorough eye examination for any conditions leading to blindness. We have one set of eyes, and strive to preserve our eyesight, hoping it stays 20/20 as long as possible. Those with failing eyesight understand more acutely the importance of 20/20 vision.

Likewise, for organizations and institutions, maintaining a 20/20 visual clarity of the present and the future is critical to their health; to see how the culture is changing, what forces are at work around them, what obstacles block the way, what they celebrate, and what they will relinquish, are aspects of 20/20 vision. They ask and answer questions, “who are we, why are we here, how are we doing, and where do we go next,” to provide visual acuity and clarity of purpose, future, and a pathway to get there. This vision guides the organization’s future.

The church also requires a keen 20/20 vision to see where God is at work, what God is doing, where God is leading. Living Saviour seeks God’s guidance and clarity of vision for our future. In the past, few congregations needed to



study or explain these things; existing was sufficient for people to come. Today, that is not so. People find meaning, purpose, and faith in a variety of places; church has become a minor player. There is also a distrust of organized religion and institutional church, so people turn their back on church, and seek spiritual nourishment and fulfillment in other ways and places. With rapid-fire change happening, Living Saviour must stop and clear its vision of the past, sharply focus on the future, and examine their present, seeking to bring laser-focus to next steps.

Our 20/20 vision is rooted and grounded in God, God’s call, and God’s purpose for us here in this corner of South Charlotte. The council and strategic planning team seek clarification about what is God’s calling for us and who is our neighbor. One “vision test,” identifying our core value words: Music, Liturgy, Sacrament; Caring, Serving, Community, Hospitality.

Another step in clarifying our vision happened at the Faith Forum on January 5, where your answers to “Why is Living Saviour on this corner of Carmel Road and what are we to do now, in the year 2020 and following?” brought into focus the belief that we are to “aid in healing a broken world,” “to heal brokenness,” and to be a place “of spiritual nourishment.”

God has a vision and a dream for this world; every congregation has a part in bringing that vision to reality. The strategic planning team is working to discover this through prayer and conversation, Living Saviour’s role in fulfilling that vision. You are invited to pray for our congregation, the planning team and your congregational council. Feel free to share additional thoughts, sharing with me.

God is faithful. God is gracious. God is with us to the end of the age in Jesus Christ.


thusiastic detail. I laughed along with him as the words poured from him regaling his exploits. Some of the children paused to listen intently as he happily told me his tale of great adventure.
