





The Discipleship Stool's 3 Legs

As spring moves toward summer, and 50 days pass since Easter, we come to the Day of Pentecost and then move into what the church calls the Season of Pentecost. From the resurrection joy, to the amazement of the out-poured Holy Spirit, to the sure and steady growth of the "green" season of the church year, we have an opportunity to deepen our discipleship. To be a disciple is to be a "learner" at heart, a follower of Christ, one who is at home in God's love, and is willing to strengthen that vital connection to the Vine and Vine Grower (John 15). I think of this as a 3-legged stool.







The leg, OUT, is about Christian service to those around us—our community, the places we reside, our country, our world. These are as simple as sharing abundantly of the resources you have with the hungry, to as complex as working for justice in a concrete and real way.

This passage from Luke 6 demonstrations Jesus living the UP IN OUT way of life.

Luke 6.12-19 "Now during those days Jesus went out to the mountain to pray; and he spent the night in prayer to God. And when day came, he called his disciples and chose twelve of them, whom he also named apostles: Simon, whom he named Peter, and his brother Andrew, and James, and John, and Philip, and Bartholomew, and Matthew, and Thomas, and James son of Alphaeus, and Simon, who was called the Zealot, and Judas son of James, and Judas Iscariot...

He came down with them and stood on a level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people...They had come to hear him and to be healed of their diseases; and those who were troubled with unclean spirits were cured..."

Verse 12—Jesus goes alone to pray, spending the night in prayer. This is UP

Verse 13-16—Jesus calls all the disciples and names the 12 apostles who will form his closest relationship. This is IN

Verse 17-19—Jesus teaches the crowds, heals them, curing them of many things. Not shut away or staying on the mountain to pray, he is in among and with those who need him the most. This is OUT. >>>



ELCA GLOBAL MISSION NEWS

(from ELCA, May 2021)

More than a year into the COVID-19 pandemic, here's the latest update on ELCA missionaries and how they're at work around the world.

When the pandemic first swept the world, the ELCA asked mission personnel to come back to the United States for a period. Since then, almost all missionaries have been able to return to their countries of service. A year later, many ELCA members have asked, "Are missionaries still serving internationally?" The answer is: Yes! The ELCA continues to send missionaries into the world to serve alongside our companions and partners in ministry, based on their needs and requests.

Currently, more than 110 Evangelical Lutheran Church in America missionary households are serving in 45 countries, including three new missionaries sent in 2020 and open positions being interviewed for in 2021. Our missionaries serve in a variety of roles, working alongside our companions to proclaim the gospel, raise up leaders, care for those in need, and help ELCA members develop relationships with our siblings in Christ around the world.

As we as a global community continue to respond to the lasting impacts of COVID-19, the rise of variants, and uncertainty surrounding vaccine rollout, the YAGM program had to cancel its second year of service in a row. This has resulted in the service of all YAGM country coordinators ending in March of this year. We give thanks for the service and pastoral presence of the Young Adults in Global Mission country coordinator team. We thank Kim Crawford, Henry Martinez, Rachel Ringlaben, Meghan Brown Saavedra, Janelle Neubauer, Kristin Engstrom, Grant and Amanda Applehans, Meghan and Gabi Aelabouni, and Zach Courter for their service, and we celebrate their contributions to the YAGM family worldwide. We continue to monitor the situation and plan to resume the YAGM program in 2022.



In engaging God's reconciling mission through accompaniment, we work to equip ourselves and our companions for our call to share the good news and to serve our neighbors. There will always be very real challenges. But God invites us to the

table, and then sends us out with our companions to share and to serve. When we tire, our companions hold us up; when our faith is weak, our companions remind us of what we have seen and shared together. In turn we hold the faith for them. God created humans for relationships for this purpose. Together, we can continue to live out God's reconciling

love.

MEANINGFUL MEALS

The discipleship stool with its 3 legs of UP IN OUT grows out of God's greatest commandment, "love the Lord your God, and love your neighbor as yourself." How do we actually live these though?

One great way to begin is to recognize how meals can build up our intentionality. Eating is something Jesus did, even on the last night giving us the Meal of Holy Communion. Eating is common to most everyone, and is a useful "pause" to help us build up, strengthen the 3 legs of discipleship.

To begin, offer thanks to God for the food (daily bread) we are to eat, is to acknowledge our dependence on God. It is to place God first. (UP)

If you are by yourself, perhaps you can find a piece of music that speaks to your spirit, helps you offer praise and joy to God. You might also use the time to offer a simple prayer for someone else; text someone and let them know you are thinking of them, praying for them, care about them. (IN) If you are eating with others, share something significant you have experienced, a God moment, something thankful for, or a way the scripture connected to your day. (IN)

If you are able, invite another Christian to eat with you, sharing a meal and getting to know them is another **IN** connection.

Finally for OUT, offer a simple prayer for the hungry, consider how you might act to provide for those who are hungry or in need. You might buy a coffee for someone in line behind you, or provide a meal for the next person in line if you are at a fast food restaurant. Another possibility is to take an interest in the people who help you get this food--grocery clerk, deli or restaurant worker. Express your genuine thanks, offer a word of kindness, use their name if they have a badge.

These are simple ways to help us grow intentionally in maturity in Christ, in joy and love of God and others.

These are just a start, find ways to add to them, I'd love to hear how you are doing **UP IN OUT.**
