Samuel: Judge, Prophet, Priest

This June and July, we will be meeting and learning about an Old Testament figure, not only the last Judge, but also a Priest and Prophet. He stood in the final stages of Israel's history with judges who oversaw their corporate life, and the coming of the first and second kings. Samuel is a hinge character between the two ways of life, and literally began life as a prayer and a hope. We typically read about his early life but rarely focus energy on his adult life. June and July present the perfect opportunity to study, Samuel, judge, prophet, priest. Much as John the Baptist is the hinge between the old testament prophetic line and the new testament Messiah and apostle's, Samuel is such a hinge as well.

Samuel is 1 of only 8 persons God calls using their name twice, "Samuel, Samuel," which we hear when the boy is asleep in the temple serving under the care of Eli. That moment commences the fulfilling of Samuel's life which began when his mother Hannah prayed fervently and longingly for a child; when her prayer was answered, she "sings" a gorgeous song prayer in 1 Samuel 2. As she promised, she dedicated her son to God and took him to live in the temple as a young child, where he grew and learned under Eli. After Eli's death, Samuel became the spokesperson for God, a priest who offered sacrifice for the return of the Ark of the Covenant from the Philistine's and set up the "Ebenezer Stone" to mark the occasion. Samuel began his life work as the judge of the people, riding circuit around Israel administering justice.

We pick up Samuel's story in Chapter 8 on June 6, as the people cry out for a leader, a king, who is not old like Samuel, who is not corrupt like Samuel's sons, a king like all the other nations have to guide and oversee their life together. The people forgot that "Yahweh," God, is their King, and they are rejecting God's authority and rule. Through the summer we will read about Samuel, the kingship of Saul, and David.

This is a fascinating story, probably written during the Exile period (586 BC) when the people of Israel were captured and scattered throughout the lands. Without a central city and a central temple, there was a need to keep telling the story of God and God's people. They commenced writing and editing the historical narratives, as well as the theological history—that is, how to makes sense of what God did and is doing and was promising yet to do, how God is with the people, and how God's power and authority are explained and why they matter.

What will Samuel and those characters from history help us learn about our lives today, and how can this story shine light on God's desire for our individual lives, but even more so, on our communal life as followers of Jesus Christ? Join in the journey, tracing God's path in history, in mystery, as we look for God's leading and guiding then and now. May it bring you closer to God and God's will for our lives.

Groceries for Neighbors in Need

A note about worship from the LSLC Council:

As you may have heard, North Carolina Governor Cooper lifted all the mask mandates and physical distance guidelines for those who are vaccinated.

Churches are no longer required to maintain distances and require masks. As the FAQs of the Executive Order #215 says, "Nothing prevents people from continuing to wear face coverings which are recommended for the unvaccinated, or those in large venues."

We on Council want to make clear, the wearing of masks is an individual decision, and there is no judgment in wearing or not wearing a mask to worship. Please do what makes you most comfortable and feeling safe. The Congregational Council has recommended:

- No reservations required, you are welcome to come as you are able to either service
- We will NOT check Vaccination records, and depend on your honesty as to whether you need a mask or not inside the building.
- Please use <u>Hand Sanitizer</u> as you enter the building.
- 10:30 will be free seating, with no requirement to maintain distance or wear a mask.
- 9:00 AM will be a "safer" service, in that we will maintain distance, ask all to wear masks, and invite anyone who is at risk or uncomfortable around, possibly unmasked worshippers, to participate in that service.
- 9:00 AM will continue to be traditional in musical style, as well as slightly abbreviated in format.
- Holy Communion will continue as it has at both services, with each person receiving elements in the narthex and self-communing.
- The offering plate will continue to be at the entrance of the sanctuary
- SINGING is still prohibited, especially without the use of masks, and we ask you to refrain from loudly speaking the responses, unless you continue to mask.
- if COVID 19 rates once again climb, we will determine the best course of action.

Please stay home if you feel unwell, or have family members who are ill. Even a simple cold is transmissible.

Each person will decide if they are comfortable gathering in the sanctuary. While we hope you are vaccinated, not to worry if not, you are still welcome.

The nursery has not restarted, and children are welcome. It may be noisy, but what a joyous noise! If anyone is ill, or has a family member with an illness, please stay home, even if you have a reservation. Better to be safe than spreading anything, even a cold.


Our discipleship stool has 3 legs, UP relationship with God, IN relationship to other Christians, and OUT relationships with the world.

- As we worship in person again, invite those you miss to come back. Find out what is hindering them, and let the leadership know if we can help in any way.
- Invite a couple or a few individuals to join you for a meal in your home or coffee on an outside patio one morning
- As theaters reopen, go to the movies together, plan a time of talking about the show afterwards
- Host a backyard gathering for your neighbors and those congregational folks who live near you.
- Book groups are another opportunity to share together
- Organize a ballgame group now that ball parks are re-opening
- Meet someone new at worship, invite them to your home, or a restaurant, get to know them and invite them to know you

You are not limited to those who attend Living Saviour when it comes to IN relationships. There may be other groups you are part of which can nurture your life in Christ.

The important thing is to find ways to be IN relationship with other believers for the mutual upbuilding of each other.
