The InnerNet

Early January 2022

The 3-year-old in our family is a precious and precocious child. He lives far from NC and so we video-chat regularly. Recently, while reading him a book about why we have Christmas, as I read the opening page, "this is the story of Jesus Christ," he stopped me and loudly said, "Nona! Don't say that!" Puzzled, I asked what I said, to which he replied, "Jesus Christ. That's a bad word Nona, we don't say that."

More puzzled than ever, as to what I had done, his dad explained, "when he was 2, someone in the extended family frequently and loudly would say, 'Jesus Christ!' as a sort of expletive, and he copied it. So, we had to stop him, and told him that was a bad word." Ah, clarity. To this little boy, the only way he'd ever heard of Jesus the Christ, was as an explosive word of anger, surprise, dismay; as a casually thrown out comment. Jesus Christ as a loving child born in a stable, long ago, as God's gift of grace and love was not part of his day to day reality. Yes, he does attend a Christian church-based preschool, and so yes, he heard the story and participated in songs and a program where he was an animal in the stable, but other than an occasional table grace, Jesus has little space in his life, or the life of his family.

As a pastor in the 21st century, and as a person of faith, this is an all too true reality in our world. Fewer than 50% of the population claim a Christian belief, report ever attending a worship service, or even being religious. Too frequently even those of us who are persons of faith, spiritual AND religious, who attend worship services regularly, have a sort of tepid faith life. One which rarely reads scripture, rarely prays out-loud or even silently, and for whom "Jesus Christ" is both Lord and a word of frustration. What has the church done in creating disciples who struggle to articulate faith, belief, trust in a living God, and who find it all to easy to use terms such as "Oh God" or "Jesus" as words that do not invite God into the situation but rather simply express emotions? How has the church failed so miserably to teach, encourage, and invite people into a life as a disciple of Jesus the Christ?

2022 is here: A New Year, a time to try new things, to be encouraged to live as a baptized follower of Jesus Christ; To spread God's love and grace to the world we inhabit; to take time to learn something new.

- Families are encouraged to consider coming back to in-person worship as the nursery will be staffed beginning January 9 with Ms. Carla, and we will be very flexible on the ages of those who attend.
- ♦ You are encouraged to try the Centering Prayer information session January 9 at 11:45 a.m. one of the ancient ways of connecting in relationship to the Trinity.
- ♦ Zoom in for study each Tuesday at 2 p.m. for a casual, no-pressure, time of learning about the upcoming worship scriptures. Attend in person Wednesday morning 10 a.m. book/bible study in the fellowship hall.
- ♦ Make plans to attend Bishop Smith's virtual Zoom Bible Study on the Gospel of Luke, **Thursdays from March 10 to April 7** from 7-8:15 p.m. Registration information will be available in January.
- Other opportunities to learn and expand the faith will be coming in the winter.

Jesus Christ is more, much more than a simple expletive. Jesus Christ is the heartbeat of God's love, made real and visible to us, who lives now and is part of the Trinity—Father, Holy Spirit, Son. Teach the children, learn yourself, Jesus is our Savior who invites us into relationship. Come and see.

Rising COVID 19 RATES

During this time of rising COVID rates, we are considering how to keep all safe and what is in the best interest of all regarding Holy Communion, singing and in person worship, as well as re-opening the nursery to the youngest ones.

Currently nothing is changed, except we even more STRONGLY urge you to stay home and use the Live Stream of worship if you are at risk for severe illness from this highly contagious variant, Omicron.

If you choose to attend in-person worship, we suggest you upgrade your mask to a KN95, an N95, or a KF94, which is designed to better provide protection. Alternatively, double masking is also suggested, with a cloth mask worn closest to the face and a surgical mask over that. This 2nd layer is typically provides a reduction in the rate of infection and has a higher rate of reducing the virus spread.

Remember to discard, change, clean, or sanitize your mask daily.

The staff and the NC Synod support vaccines and boosters for all who attend worship, lead worship, and conduct business in our building.

Many thanks to all who provided the gift of time—to sing, play instruments, decorate, set the altar, clean up, and generally make things run more smoothly.




Donating Blood saves lives, and it is a gift that you can do when you are healthy and able to do so.

Quilt Ministry News!



- Laura Michael, RN, is enrolled in the Faith Community Nursing (FCN) Foundations course which will certify her as one of two Faith Community Nurses at Living Saviour
- The Health and Wholeness Ministry is currently setting up a space at Living Savior (2nd room on the left entering the Sunday School hallway) to house medical assessment equipment provided by Atrium as well as a library of health information resources. This space will provide the opportunity to offer health education consultations for members of the congregation as well as residents of the surrounding community. (The space will also continue being shared by the Scouting program and would be available for Sunday School as well.)

 for a few minutes to be introduced to this ancient Christian Prayer Practice proving to be
 beneficial to us today. If you are not present in person, consider joining us virtually. A Zoom

- Research is clear that regular daily calming practices such as good sleep, contemplation, meditation, and mindfulness provide significant benefits to physical, mental and spiritual health.
