#### WHAT WILL MY CHILD LEARN AT LIVING SAVIOUR PRESCHOOL?

#### **Our Philosophy**

Living Saviour Lutheran Preschool believes that each child is fearfully and wonderfully made (Psalm 139:14). During a child's earliest years of life there are many "windows of opportunity" for learning and developing that are unique to their specific age group. God designed a child's brain to grow more during these first few years than at any other time and patterns are developed in these formative years that will affect the child's growth and development forever. Our Preschool program is designed to meet each student's unique developmental needs by offering a stimulating hands-on approach to the learning environment and curriculum. This encourages appropriate development for the child's intellectual ability, emotional stability, social competency, and spiritual awareness and maturity.

#### **Program Goals**

Nurture young children into being confident and eager to learn

Teamwork with parents and respect them as being the primary and most important provider of care Create an environment that is responsive to the child's INDIVIDUAL needs

Provide developmentally appropriate activities to enhance and refine children's learning Integrate all areas of learning with a biblical worldview

#### Curriculum

The Preschool is adapting the Teaching Strategies Creative Curriculum as our new curriculum. This is the same curriculum that the CMS system incorporates into their classrooms. Creative Curriculum is committed to providing a powerful solution that combines curriculum, assessment, professional development, classroom materials, and family engagement to ensure children are set up for success.

<u>Literature</u>- The Creative Curriculum utilizes daily resources focused on language and literacy skill development, and read aloud using their children's book collection from a wide range of genres that explore life in other cultures, celebrate diversity, spark curiosity, and inspire children's imaginations.

<u>Science</u> - Students will engage in science experiences that will allow them to explore, experiment, predict, observe, and communicate ideas and findings using teacher planned and open-ended hands-on science activities.

<u>Handwriting (3-year old's/Pre-K)</u>) -The Handwriting Without Tears® This program incorporates child-friendly teaching strategies, such as using music and movement to bring lessons to life, and multisensory manipulatives to build fine and gross motor skills. Our readiness and writing lessons teach body awareness, cooperation, taking turns, listening, crayon grip, drawing, building, letter and number recognition, capital letter and number formation.

<u>Mathematics (Pre-K)</u> -Creative Curriculum includes meaningful discussions and applications to develop the essential mathematical process skills of problem-solving, reasoning, communicating, making connections, and representing. Just like these skills are used by children in their daily lives, we integrate mathematics skill each day in our pre-k curriculum.

#### **ENDOWMENT COMMITTEE UPDATE**

The 2023 Endowment Committee met on February 21. Jean Dunne was introduced as a new member of the Committee. Officers were elected. Barbara was re-elected as Chair, Steve as Vice-Chair. The Committee has \$9,685 to distribute during 2023. This is the permitted 5% distribution from the endowment account balance as of December 31, 2022. The Fund experienced significant market reductions during 2022 and we hope for some reversal in the coming months.

The Committee received and reviewed three funding requests. These requests were for The Community Table at Bethlehem Lutheran Church (New Orleans), Community Culinary School of Charlotte and Loaves & fishes/Friendship Trays, Inc. The Committee approved grants to these organizations in the following amounts: \$1,250, \$1,250 and \$1,000 respectively.

The Committee's next meeting is scheduled for May 9.

As a reminder, requests for funds from the Endowment may be submitted by congregation members on behalf of organizations or directly by organizations who meet the guidelines. The guidelines and request form are on the church's website with information about grants awarded during the past several years. ## **Summary of 19 March 2023 Council Meeting**

The March 2023 council meeting was held on the third Sunday in March and all members of council were present for the meeting.

The Shabla Gift Fund task force has received a quote for repairs to the sanctuary walls behind the choir. There is damage to the ceiling in that area from a leak and the task force is in the process of getting a quote for those repairs as well. All the projects that the task force received permission from the council to go forth with should be finished soon and should be well within budget. Permits for a new electronic sign are in progress and the task force is working with contractors about the sign's design and receiving quotes about the cost.

The Endowment Committee met on February 21, 2023 and Jean Dunne was introduced as a new member. Barbara Avard was re-elected as Chairperson and Steve Axtman was re-elected as Vice Chairperson. The committee received and reviewed three funding requests. These requests were for The Community Table at Bethlehem Lutheran Church in New Orleans (we have supported Bethlehem Lutheran in the past, both for their food program and their building program), Community Culinary School of Charlotte, and Loaves and Fishes/Friendship Trays, Inc. The Committee approved grants to these organizations.

Council received a request from Moss Hathcock that half of the money in the C.D. Hathcock Memorial Fund be transferred to Living Saviour Preschool. The council approved that request.

Based on the call process questionnaire, youth are a high priority to the congregation so council needs to begin working on both providing programs for our youth as well as finding ways to get children still on our membership rolls back to attending church. We should also meet with new families and see what they would like us to provide for their children.

The call process is moving along. The MSP is nearing completion and once complete, it will be sent to council for approval. Once approved, the call committee can begin its training.

Council approved the request of the craft fair group to have our annual Christmas Craft Fair on Saturday December 2, 2023.

Council approved having a continental breakfast on Easter Sunday from 9:00 AM to 10:15 AM.

The April council meeting will be on the fourth Sunday, April 23, so that Pastor Charlie Zimmerman can attend.
