# The InnerNet

#### December 2023

"So, Pastor, when can we start singing Christmas carols?"

Actually, no one has asked about this – but I imagine it's lingering in your minds. And, truth be told, my car radio and my office spotify are already tuned to "Holiday Classics." But, not in worship...at least not yet. As you know, the "Twelve Days of Christmas" are the twelve days FOLLOWING Christmas morning ending on Epiphany (when the Magi arrived). That's right! Christmas has its own season in the church year.

For now, we prepare for the "Advent"-ure that is coming.

As the days grow shorter and darkness comes faster, it is easy to get disoriented. But, being disoriented isn't always bad. As a matter of fact, the coming of God in the flesh of Jesus is disorienting. As Mary reminds us, "He has brought down the powerful from their thrones and lifted up the lowly. He has filled the hungry with good things and sent the rich away empty" (Luke 1.52-53). And darkness isn't bad either. In fact, without darkness, we aren't. Remember, creation began in darkness. Seeds grow in the darkness of soil. Our bodies get their rest and renewal in the rhythm of darkness. In fact, according to the National Institute of Health "growth hormone is typically released in children primarily during sleep" (<a href="https://factor.niehs.nih.gov/2022/11/papers/sleep-growth-hormone">hormone</a>). Maybe the challenge is that in darkness and disorientation, we realize that we are not in charge and don't always have the clarity of direction that we wish we did.

Enter music... During this time of Advent, pay attention to the music – the tunes, the rhythm and the words. Sometimes the rhythm is easy and the tune flows naturally. Other times it is unfamiliar. That's okay. Sometimes unfamiliarity causes us to slow down and see or listen in ways we otherwise may not. Especially in these days leading up to Christmas, it is easy to get caught up in the commercialism and easy "jingles" that surround us and miss the disorientation (and re-orientation) that Jesus' coming calls us to, just as it is easy to get so blinded by the bright lights that we miss the new creation that springs forth from darkness.

Here's the promise...The one who created "in the beginning" is continuing to create and carries you and all of us in the divine hands, promising to travel with us when the rhythms and tunes are familiar and when they aren't. This is the one who calls us into the adventure of Advent. And this is the one whose coming we await. Slow down. Pay attention.



#### **November 2023 Council Meeting Summary**

Health and Wholeness reported that yoga classes and the 12-step program continue to meet at their scheduled times and that the hospitality shown by us on election day brought two new members to the yoga classes and one new member to the 12-step program. The theme for November is "caring for the carer." Blood pressure checks will be done during the Craft Fair on 2 December. A seminar is being planned for a Saturday in April 2024 on various topics concerning Alzheimer's. The fire safety task force met to work out fire drill details and we will have a practice fire drill before we have the real thing.

Pastor Sara has been talking with other Lutheran churches in the area about the Youth Gathering in New Orleans in July 2024. Pastor would like the council to begin the process of deciding our core values and a representative from the Synod will join council via Zoom during the December council meeting to discuss the process and offer guidance.

Pastor Sara, Barbara, Janet, and Steve met with JamieyGraves about having him review and help us upgrade our technology.

Barbara gave council the monthly financial report and the general fund appears to be in good shape and we should end the year with a nearly balanced budget or one with a slight surplus or deficit.

Barbara also gave the Endowment report and the remaining funds for this year were distributed with Project Outpour receiving \$500, Living Saviour Preschool receiving \$800 (to be used for scholarship or tuition assistance), and Second Harvest Metrolina receiving \$385 (which will be matched by another donor at Foodbank).

Council will begin working on the annual report and the 2024-2025 budget to be ready for the January annual congregational meeting.



#### Ministry of Health and Wholeness December 2023 Giving the Gift of Presence

"Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you?" **1 Corinthians 3:16** 

#### **December Focus:**

Nursing has defined Presence as a way of being and a way of relating; a way that promotes healing potential and wellbeing. This is no surprise to Christians who believe that every individual is the dwelling place of God's Spirit. As we allow our essential

nature to be truly and fully Present to other human beings, we are offering ourselves as a vehicle or conduit of God's Divine Love. This Divine Love that flows through human beings is thought to be the most powerful healing medicine available. Watch for a publication booklet in December that shares some thoughts regarding how to be Present with other in a time of desperate longing for connection, so that we live into giving to each other the gift of connecting to Divine Loving Presence this Holy Day season. Also take an opportunity to explore the variety of Yoga classes offered in the spaces of Living Saviour Lutheran Church. Yoga literally means to "yoke oneself to God" and was developed as an ancient practice to assist with experiencing the Presence of God within and among us.
