You can do a good deed by washing a vehicle and sending the driver off with our blessing for renewal. Wear your rubber boots, your crazy raincoat, or simply shorts and t-shirt to get wet and soapy! The young ones cannot have all the fun, we less than young ones can too!

Everyone receiving will be wearing a mask. We will be outside, and we will have hand-sanitizer. We plan to be safe, have fun, and be together showing the neighbors we can continue to be church, do God's work, even in the midst of troubling times.



3. Small American flags to remember those who sacrificed their lives or their health trying to save others.
4. An eyeglass collection . This collection will go the Lion's Club, which re-uses and ships eyeglasses to those in need all over the world.
5. A collection for nonperishable foods for Smithfield Elementary School families or Loaves and Fishes.
