

April 2025 Health and Wholeness Tip #3 H/W ministry team.

The Health and Wholeness focus for April is Caring for our Earth.

Grow native plants. They provide food and shelter for local wildlife. They create beneficial relationships that promote healthy ecosystems. Planting native plants helps prevent the spread of unhealthy invasive species. They improve soil health with their deep roots and help filter pollutants from storm water runoff. They require less maintenance since they are adapted to local conditions.
