Grace to you and peace from God our Father and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

As this new year begins, it already feels heavy to me.

So many sound bites and video clips. So much anxiety and fear...Some totally legitimate, some perhaps not. So many concerns about how/what we as a church and congregation are to address - if anything - in the current cultural and political climate. It feels like an especially relevant "What would Jesus do?" time. Even approaching the subject feels risky.

And yet, it is important to remember that there is a distinct difference between political and partisan. The word "politics" itself has to do with how people live together ("polis"=city or community) and is the root for words like "policy" (guidelines about how we live together). Also, it is important to remember that, Jesus, the one we claim to follow and strive to live like, was decidedly political in his teachings and healings and advocacy — modelling and calling for dignity, compassion, care, for all...especially for the least of these (Matthew 25). My prayer is that LSLC be a place that allows for intentional contemplation and conversation around current issues. Always leading with love and looking out for the least. It is certain that we will **not** likely agree on "What is to be done" (e.g. What is to be done about immigration or housing or gender-identity and care, or... or...or...?), but I am confident that the answer to "How it is to be done" is always "Like Jesus" (e.g. with dignity and compassion and love)...Always leading with the understanding that every single human is created in the image of God and so is deserving of dignity. Too, I am confident that our "Why" is clear. Why do we behave this way? Because we follow the way of Jesus; which is the way of love.

May "they know we are Christians by our love."



### **Open Letter from Lutheran Services Carolinas**

Dear Friends,

In Matthew 25:35, Jesus says, "For I was hungry, and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty, and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger, and you invited me in." This powerful verse reminds us that, as Christians, we are called to show compassion and hospitality, especially towards those who are most vulnerable.

In today's ever-changing world, filled with challenges and divisions, Lutheran Services Carolina (LSC) continues to stay the course to ensure we are there to serve the marginalized. For over 45 years, LSC has cared for refugees through its New Americans Program. I have personally witnessed many changes over my 24 years as LSC President—in the world, in politics, and in our work. However, one thing remains steadfast: as Lutherans, we have a long tradition of "welcoming the stranger." This tradition dates to World War II, at least to my knowledge, when my mother's home church in Dallas, NC, welcomed a family fleeing war and persecution.

Over the coming years, LSC expects changes in the number of legal refugees arriving in the Carolinas. However, our commitment remains unwavering: we will continue to support the individuals and families in our programs. Thousands of individuals who have become our neighbors in the last few years still rely on LSC's support, and with your partnership, we can sustain and expand our services to meet their needs.

These vital programs require funding, and we hope you will consider helping us continue the work we are called to do as Christians. Your support can help us provide resettlement services, language and cultural orientation programs, trauma-informed care, and educational programs for children and adults. # Summary of 19 January 2025 Congregation Council Meeting

The Council continued working with the financial committee to finalize the budget for the 2025-2026 fiscal year so that it can be presented to the congregation at the annual meeting on 26 January 2025.

A thermostat in the preschool malfunctioned leaving the preschool without heat. The thermostat was under warranty and has been repaired. One of the HVAC units had a faulty ball bearing and it has been repaired under warranty.

The treasurer report stated that in December we had a net loss of income of approximately \$8,000 but that we should end the fiscal year with a slight surplus.

Health and Wholeness reported that chair yoga classes will resume on 6 February 2025. On 21 January 2025, there will be a lunch and learn on anxiety and mental health in the Fellowship Hall from 11am to 1pm. On 16 February 2025, Andy Williams, a paramedic with Mecklenburg County EMS (Medic) will have an informal question and answer session from 9am to 10am about what to expect if you call 911 with a medical emergency.

The confirmation youth have expressed interest in having a dinner meeting monthly at someone's home and doing a service project quarterly.

Pastor Sara attended a zoom meeting with Mecklenburg Ministries and they have many interfaith programs available for adults and youth.

Council expressed their thanks to the outgoing members, Steve Vick, Pat Sipe, and Janet Axtman for their service and contributions. Steve and Pat Snodgrass have agreed to be our lay ministers at the Synod Assembly in May.

The slate of candidates running for Council at the Annual Meeting, Ken Lesser, Kay Zimmerman, Donna Thomas, and Pat Snodgrass was approved by Council. New Council members will be installed at the worship service on 2 February 2025.

The Council will have a retreat on Saturday 8 February 2025 at LSLC with Rev. CeCee Mills to focus on our core values.

#### **Summary of LSLC Annual Congregational Meeting**

26 January 2025

The meeting was led by the Council co-presidents, Steve Vick, and Pr. Linda Hatcher. They reminded members of our mission: We welcome people to Jesus Christ, we equip them to grow in faith, and we send them to serve others. Pastor Linda gave the opening prayer.

There was a motion to approve the minutes of last years Annual Meeting, held on 28 January 2024. The motion was seconded and approved by voice vote.

There was a power point presentation of the events that happened since the 2024 Annual Meeting.

Elsie Davis took over as interim preschool director.

In the 14 months since Pastor Sara accepted our call, we have added 29 new members. We have had baptisms, weddings, and our annual Christmas concert. We had the confirmation of Nora Cook, a retreat for the youth, the start of Strive AOB (affirmation of baptism), the addition of noisy offerings (which has raised over \$4,000), inner generational Sunday School classes as well as adult Sunday School classes. Members have volunteered for Room at the Inn, the blood mobile, help for victims of hurricane Helene in the mountains of North Carolina, and assistance for Ukrainian refugees.

The Health and Wholeness ministry has continued with yoga and exercise classes and has presented seminars and lunch and learn events. LSLC has provided food assistance and hospitality, clothing assistance, presented a Craft Fair, Breakfast with Santa, helped at St. Matthews meal preparation, offered and supported Lutheroad day camp, first Tuesday free coffee giveaway, and our longest running outreach program, the cub and boy scouts.

The four candidates for Congregation Council are Ken Lesser, Donna Thomas, Kay Zimmerman, and Pat Snodgrass. There was a motion to approve these four candidates for election to three-year terms on the LSLC Council beginning on 26 January 2025. This motion was seconded and approved by voice vote.

The was a motion to approve Steve Vick and Pat Snodgrass as our Lay Ministers to the Synod Assembly in May 2025. This motion was seconded and approved by voice vote.

There was a report on facilities needs and repairs. Facilities expenses have increased due to the age of our building and its increased use.

Debby Borrelli of the finance committee presented a financial review of the 2024-2025 budget and the proposed 2025-2026 budget. Final figures for the 2024-2025 budget will not be available until the year closes out on 31 January 2025 but it looks like we have turned a projected deficit of \$31,264 into a surplus of \$2,141, a swing of \$33,405, all due to the generous giving of our congregation. The proposed budget for 2025-2026 estimates income of \$440,815 and expenses of \$451,218, leaving us with a deficit of \$10,403. Considering the turnaround this congregation did with the current budget, the Council feels confident that by next years Annual Meeting, that deficit will be lower or we will have a balanced budget.

There is a motion to approve the proposed 2025-2026 budget. The motion is seconded and approved by voice vote.

Pastor Sara gave the closing prayer.
