Four of us (three confirmation students and I) attended Kairos Camp the week of June 16. There were about 100 (probably a little more) participants in that program (including kids, counselors and adult leaders). "Kairos" means "God's time," as over against "Chronos" which is "human time" (i.e. chronology). Camp is a time to be intentionally trying to live in "God's time." Intentionally taking time to look for and see God moving and breathing in the space and in each person. I have lots of favorite parts of camp (I know, I know... "favorite" implies only one...*mea culpa*). Here are a few:

- ◆ Seeing relationships form between people (campers/counselors) who – left to their own devices – would likely never find themselves in the same place, intentionally looking for the same thing at the same time (in this case "God-moments" ...or moments throughout the day when you are aware that God is present).
- ◆ Seeing campers (who began the week as strangers) sing and dance and conga line together (Little did they realize the power of helping lead and follow while staying connected to one another and making sure no one is left out – which is really what it takes to form a cohesive conga line). Music is powerful in that way... connecting us.
- ◆ Hearing them in call-and-response proclaim:
 - "Grace is like an ocean!" (Grace is like an ocean!)
 - "Grace is overflowing!" (It "be" overflowing!)
 - "My soul can't even hold it!" (It can't even hold it!)
 - "Grace is like an ocean!" (You better learn to swim!)

These confirmation students are at different points in their confirmation process and attending different congregations which all have different timelines/processes. Regardless, though, the vast majority of them come from a Lutheran perspective. And while Lutherans don't have a corner on the "grace" market, we sure do like to talk about it an awful lot. That said, as adults though, we can tend to try to control grace (which is really just code for "the unmerited love of God poured out on **every single person no matter what!**"). Kids, on the other hand, sing and dance and prepare to swim and splash in it. And if they or their neighbor can't swim, they join the conga line and get carried along in the joy.

Maybe we should all conga-line our way up to Christ's Table each week.

Other non-pledge giving also varies; miscellaneous income is dependent on activities scheduled on church property for which we receive payment (elections, recitals, other events that provide fees). Some expenses of the church also vary. Some are seasonally impacted, some maintenance-related may only be billed once or twice a year and others vary with planned activities.

Congregation Council Meeting 23 June 2024

There was an update on our finding a candidate to fill the upcoming vacancy for treasurer. A person was interviewed who has experience as treasurer at a larger church here in Charlotte. This would be on a part time basis, probably five hours a week, possibly more at the end of the month when reports are due.

Financial reports show that as of the end of May, the first quarter of our budget year, the church is showing a surplus, although not all expenses have been billed yet. Thank you for your continued generosity, as it allows us to begin dreaming about our future.

Pastor Sara submitted her report and has requested that Council approve her taking two Sundays in August (August 11&18) off for vacation.

Health and Wholeness reported that details of the fire drill will be given before worship on Sunday 28 July. Lori has also requested to use the Fellowship Hall for free yoga classes on Saturday 27 July and Saturday 3 August from 11:30 to 12:30 to attract new students. Council approved her request.

Glenda Kilminister has taken on providing meals for members while Pat Sipe recovers from her illness. Pastor Sara and Pastor Linda are developing a class for members to learn how to give communion to members who are unable to attend worship service in person.

Council discussed the options on how to finance the water remediation project and approved the option to pay the cost in full from the facilities reserve and use the interest from the church's certificate of deposit to repay the facilities reserves. Also, any donations from members to the remediation project will be put into the facilities reserves.

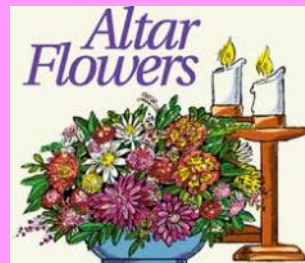

The Adult Sunday School class will continue meeting into the summer to discuss Amy-Jill Levine's book, **The Bible With and Without Jesus: How Jews and Christians Read the Same Stories Differently**. The discussions will begin on May 4 @ 9:15 am in the Education Wing Room 6. PLEASE join us!!

Esteemed Bible scholars and teachers Amy-Jill Levine and Marc Z. Brettler take readers on a guided tour of the most popular Hebrew Bible passages quoted in the New Testament to show what the texts meant in their original contexts and then how Jews and Christians, over time, understood those same texts. Passages include the creation of the world, the role of Adam and Eve, the Suffering Servant of Isaiah, the book of Jonah, and Psalm 22, whose words, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me," Jesus quotes as he dies on the cross.

Comparing various interpretations – historical, literary, and theological - of each ancient text, Levine and Brettler offer deeper understandings of the original narratives and their many afterlives. They show how the text speaks to different generations under changed circumstances, and so illuminate the Bible's ongoing significance. By understanding the depth and variety by which these passages have been, and can be, understood, *The Bible With and Without Jesus* does more than enhance our religious understandings, it helps us to see the Bible as a source of inspiration for any and all readers.

Focus: Disease Prevention through Exercise

*I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship.
Romans 12:1*

Physical activity can prevent or control high blood pressure, heart attack and stroke as well as diabetes. The World Health Organization recommends children and teens average 60 minutes /day of moderate to vigorous exercise. Adults need at least 150 hours/week(30 minutes 5x/week) of moderate to vigorous exercise.
